Social Media—SAFEGUARDING CONCERNS

Fortnite reminder PG12—this game is being acted out by children in FS2. Please can I remind parents that this game is suitable for pupils aged 12 and up.

Snapchat and On-line chat forums—School is increasingly dealing with inappropriate language and intimidating behaviour through these forums. The legal age is 13 for pupils to access. School staff will not be involved with incidents outside of school unless it is an action on our premises. Please check your child's phone, as the messages between our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils is inappropriate and harmful to their mental health.

School has provided Year 5 and 6 E-safety workshops this term and further arranged for a Community Police Officer to talk to the Year 5 and 6 pupils on 22nd March, in regards to Anti-social behaviour, impacts of that within our communities and also look at the age of criminal responsibility and what kinds of behaviour can constitute a criminal offence.

We ask support of parents to monitor and check your child's phones regularly and if you have concerns report to the police. Parents are accountable for the pupil's actions outside of school hours.

Wishing everyone and enjoyable half-term break and we welcome the pupils back on 1st March.
